2006 PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE OTTAWA CHAPTER, OAS Heather Stronach

The year 2006 has been another successful year for the Ottawa Chapter! This would not have been possible without the volunteer support of the membership-at-large, stimulating monthly speakers, people and organizations we partner with, and the dedicated Chapter Executive. Our membership reached 56 and this translated into more than 1300 volunteer hours. I applaud and greatly appreciate your support of the Chapter and your efforts.

At our monthly public meetings, we had a full complement of speakers on a variety of topics, which for the most part, focused on the archaeology of Canada.

Our Public Archaeology Programme continued to remain strong. We celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Chapter's partnership with Bonnechere Parks by getting together with the partners to review the past and to project into the future. We supported the Friends of Bonnechere Parks by reviewing their Virtual Museum launched last year. In spite of inclement weather, we had volunteers come to Public Archaeology Day at the Higginson Tower in Vankleek Hill prior to its restoration. We continued with the Hogg's Bay programme for the third year. Recently, we have formed a liaison with Pinhey's Point Provincial Park and will participate in their 'Riverfest' in August. We continued to talk to students in the classroom and to senior citizens. We 'manned' an OAS, Ottawa Chapter booth at Heritage Day in February. Brenda Kennett's Public Archaeology Report elaborates on all of these activities.

The PAPA award, administered by the Chapter in the person of Peggy Smyth, continues to be active. In 2006, our Vice-President, Jim Molnar presented this award to the Boyd Archaeology Field School.

Marian Clark, member and a past president, was the recipient of the Bonnechere Parks Board of Directors' Award for the tremendous contribution to archaeology and to the programme we have come to call 'The Dig, Pig and Jig'. Congratulations, Marion! The Ottawa Chapter, as a whole, received an award from the Bonnechere Parks for recognition in "Excellence in Partnership".

We agreed in principle to an MOU with OAS that serves as a guideline with respect to the link between the Chapters and OAS, Inc. All Chapters will sign this MOU early in 2007.

By no means the least, this year we have managed to bring Chapter documents, display boards, information, and belongings, all together UNDER ONE ROOF! at the Diefenbunker, where we rent storage space. We have done a general inventory of what is there.

We recognize the importance of partnerships to provide opportunities for joint ventures and to increase our exposure. We have an informal relationship with the Archaeological Institute of America (AIA) where we give notice of each other's meetings. We do the same with the Canadian Institute in Greece (CIG) and I was invited to thank their recent speaker as a gesture of that relationship. We are a member of CHOO/COPO and receive notices of events of all their

member organizations. Our challenge is how to get the relevant information to you in a timely fashion.

In 2006, the secretary continued supporting the chapter's activities by:

DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC ARCHAEOLOGY REPORT 2006

Once again, the Ottawa Chapter participated in a number of events in 2007 that brought archaeology to the wider public.

To start the year, Chapter members Heather Stronach, Glenna Roberts and Cara Pelletier set up our display at Ottawa City Hall for Heritage Day on February 20th. In April, Cara Pelletier spoke to students at the l'Ecole secondaire Béatrice-Desloges in Orleans and Glenna Roberts spoke to 'Food for Thought,' an Ottawa luncheon club for seniors. Thanks to the intervention of Jean-Luc Pilon some archaeology was done at Higginson Tower in Vankleek Hill in association with a project to restore this observation tower, originally built as a wind-powered grist mill in the 1830s. As part of this project, a public archaeology day was held on May 20th under the direction of Jeff Earl with local residents and several members of the Ottawa Chapter participating in the excavation. On the evening of June 16th, Lois King, Bill MacLennan and Bill's daughter, Elise, set up several archaeological activities for family and friends supporting participants in the Orleans Relay for Life.

Chapter members returned to Bonnechere Provincial Park on August 12th for our annual Archaeology Day. The event was very successful with many members of the public, both young and old, spending lots of time at the various activities and displays. The day also saw the Friends of Bonnechere Parks launch their Virtual Museum Project entitled "Land of the Spirits." This interactive website showcases the natural and human heritage of the surrounding Bonnechere River area and features many of the artifacts and stories uncovered during the past ten years of excavations involving the Ottawa Chapter. In recognition of the tenth anniversary of the association between the Ottawa Chapter and the Park, the Friends of Bonnechere Parks presented the Ottawa Chapter with a special plaque during the celebrations. On Saturday evening, Joanne Lea, an educator and archaeologist, gave an informative overview of public archaeology projects across Canada. As always, this was a great weekend for Chapter members to get together in a beautiful park and share their archaeological knowledge with the public. Thanks to park staff for their assistance with the event and their great hospitality.

The annual "Dig, Pig and Jig" weekend was held at Bonnechere Provincial Park on September 16th and 17th. The 'Walk Back in Time' on Saturday involved a full day of exploration along the Little Bonnechere River with stops at numerous archaeological sites. The outing was led by Park Superintendent Jim Fraser with lots of input from others who have directed or participated in the various archaeological excavations over the years, most notably Tom Ballantine and Rory MacKay. This proved to be an extremely valuable opportunity to review much of the work that has already been done and to gain new insights into the rich cultural heritage of the watershed. On Saturday evening we were all treated to the Friends' fabulous roast pork dinner. After the dinner, the Friends presented long time Ottawa Chapter member Marian Clark with their annual Directors' Award in recognition of her many years contributing to public archaeology activities at the Park. The evening wrapped up with the viewing of several early movies depicting life and logging in the region in the 1950s. On Sunday morning there was a roundtable discussion on the past, present and future of public archaeology at Bonnechere Parks. Although there are many challenges facing a successful public archaeology program, everyone agreed that there are great

benefits to be realized and lots of ideas for moving forward were presented.

Finally, Ottawa Chapter members returned to Murphys Point Provincial Park from October 2nd to 6th for the third edition of the park's archaeology program for school groups. Each day a different Grade 5 class from one of the Perth/Smiths Falls area schools came out to the park to experience hands-on archaeology including excavation, artifact analysis, and site mapping activities. Jeff Earl and I acted as the licensed archaeologists. Ottawa Chapter members including Ellen Blaubergs, Marian Clark and Heather Stronach along with other archaeologists, park staff and volunteers from the Friends of Murphys Point Park provided supervision.

Many thanks to all the Chapter members who participated in these events and contributed to their success! After three years, this is my 'good-bye' as Director of Public Archaeology. I have very much enjoyed getting to know many of you better and look forward to participating in future events. It is a pleasure to hand the reins over to André Miller who will bring new energy and fresh ideas to the Ottawa Chapter in general and to the Public Archaeology portfolio in particular. I know that he will do a great job and that you, the membership, will give him great support.
